Whoever did this has tremendous potential if this is what they can produce in high school -- this could compete with some professional designs. The concept is simple and timely. The large "Censored" image jumps out at you, crackled just as a crude stamp would be. After a moment of looking at how crisp it is, the reader

notices the subtle detail of the books whose covers have actually been censored. The contrast between that simple, almost invisible detail, and the loud, blaring word conveys to the reader what this issue is about: very loud voices demanding very quiet omissions from libraries.
